THE TEANAWAY COMMUNITY FOREST IS BURSTING WITH LIFE



Within the Teanaway Community Forest's uniquely diverse habitats totaling 50,241 acres, you might encounter wolves, elk, deer, black bear, mountain lions, bobcats, snowshoe hare, and, of course, birds! Habitats range from lush riparian corridors along the Teanaway River and its tributaries; dry ponderosa pine/Douglas fir forest; mature, old forest habitat; and upland meadows. Each of these habitat types affords you the opportunity to see and hear a surprising variety of bird species.

This checklist includes 181 species of birds that are possible to find in the Teanaway Community Forest. Some are common year-round residents, many arrive in the spring to nest and raise their young then head south in the winter, and a few are uncommon or even rare like the Spotted owl.

Whatever the season, birding in the breathtaking scenery of the Teanaway Community Forest is challenging and rewarding.
