

Mountains to Sound Greenway National Heritage Area




The Mountains to Sound Greenway encompasses over 1.5 million acres of connected natural lands and vibrant urban areas surrounding I-90 between Puget Sound and Central Washington. The Greenway conserves a shared heritage of working farms and forests, parks, sustainable communities and abundant outdoor educational and recreational opportunities. The Greenway is bounded by three major watersheds within King and Kittitas Counties, the Yakima River basin upstream of Ellensburg, the Snoqualmie Valley in King County and the Cedar-Lake Washington watersheds, as well as the waters flowing through the City of Seattle.


