


Mountains to Sound Greenway National Heritage Area




The Mountains to Sound Greenway encompasses over 1.5 million acres of connected natural lands and vibrant urban areas surrounding I-90 between Puget Sound and Central Washington. The Greenway conserves a shared heritage of working farms and forests, parks, sustainable communities and abundant outdoor educational and recreational opportunities. This map illustrates the role and distribution of our public land managers. Federal, state, and municipal agencies steward forests, parks, and watersheds for the public. Together, they manage close to two thirds of all lands in the Mountains to Sound Greenway.
