


# Mountains to Sound Greenway National Heritage Area




The Mountains to Sound Greenway encompasses over 1.5 million acres of connected natural lands and vibrant urban areas surrounding I-90 between Puget Sound and Central Washington. The Greenway conserves a shared heritage of working farms and forests, parks, sustainable communities and abundant outdoor educational and recreational opportunities. Since 1990, 338,895 acres of land have been conserved through actions by federal, state, and municipal agencies along with community and non-profit partners. Together with previously conserved lands the Greenway National Heritage Area is comprised of almost two thirds public or privately conserved lands.
